

Reef Balls Come to Calabash, NC For The First Time.

Amber and other family members placed Michael's ashes and other trinkets of memorabilia into environmentally-friendly concrete to forever remember and memorialize Michael as he lives on amidst the teeming marine life in the ocean. To aid and replenish the ocean's diminishing reef systems, Eternal Reefs placed eco-friendly, underwater reef balls off the Calabash, NC coast in April. Eternal Reefs are placed in Coast Guard-approved locations off the US coastline. This is the first time Eternal Reefs has come to the Calabash-Southport area.

Headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia, Eternal Reefs, Inc. provides a creative, environmentally enhancing means to memorialize the cremated remains of a loved one. For families and individuals that choose cremation rather than burial, Eternal Reefs offers a new memorial choice that

replaces cremation urns and ash scattering with a permanent environmental living legacy.

An Eternal Reefs
"memorial reef" is a
designed reef system of
environmentally safe cast
concrete that is used to create new marine habitats for
fish and other forms of sea

life. Eternal Reefs takes the cremated remains and incorporates them into a cement mixture used to cast designed artificial reef formations. The memorial reefs are taken to a curing area and then placed in the permitted ocean location selected by the individual, friend or family member.

Foundation was created in 1992 by a group of environmentally conscious college friends who enjoyed diving. In order to reclaim the lost natural reefs, the foundation developed a patented mold system

with an environmentally friendly concrete formula. With their advanced technology in the development of these new reefs called, "reef balls," The Reef Ball Foundation became the recognized leader in scientifically designed artificial reefs. By 2005, there have been more than 400,000

reef balls placed in the ocean worldwide.

Eternal Reefs, Inc. was created in 1998 when Carleton Glen Palmer, the father-in-law of Eternal Reefs founder, Don Brawley, requested that his cremated remains be added to the concrete in one of The Reef Ball Foundation's reefs. On May 1, 1998, the first in a series of memorial

reefs was cast with Carlton
Palmer's cremated remains.
These memorials were
placed in the Gulf of
Mexico to create a beautiful
reef that is now teeming
with sea life.

In 2001, the first Eternal Reefs Memorial Reef dedication was held in Charleston, South Carolina. Expected to last 500 years, over 300 Memorial Reefs, have been placed off the coasts of Florida, South Carolina, North Carolina, Maryland, New Jersey, Texas and Virginia.
